

BEHAVIOUR POLICY

STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

Students should comply with the following principles and have regard for the happiness and safety of all members of the school community

- Students should be polite, helpful and supportive to staff and other students and comply with staff requests immediately and without question
- Physical or verbal abuse towards staff or other students will not be tolerated
- No student has the right to shout out and disrupt a class or the right of others to learn
- Intolerance of race, creed or sexual orientation is not acceptable either in the classroom or in any part of school
- Every child has the right to be safe and no bullying whether cyber, physical, verbal or psychological will be tolerated in school
- The property belonging to individual students should be respected and not touched or taken by anyone else
- Students should have due regard for the health and safety of themselves and others and take responsibility for their actions.
- Students should not use out of bounds areas or leave the school site at lunchtime without permission
- All students should wear the school uniform correctly and have basic school equipment and books for each lesson
- Classwork and homework must be completed to the highest possible standard and handed in on time
- Students should respect the school buildings, equipment and surroundings and help to keep them free from litter and graffiti. This extends to all school transport
- Students should attend school regularly and on time and should arrive to every lesson promptly

The following things should not be brought into school: tobacco, e-cigarettes, alcohol, drugs, weapons (real or replica), knives/ blades / razor blades, chewing gum, drinks cans and glass bottles, aerosols, jewellery. Gadgets eg. mobile phones, MP3 /IPODplayers must not be used in school.
