Course Overview:	<p>Students learn vocabulary and use a variety of grammatical structures covering three themes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identity and Culture • Local, national , international and global areas of interest • Current and future study an employment <p>These themes are sub-divided into more recognisable topics e.g. self and family, freetime, hometown, holidays, school.</p> <p>There is an increased emphasis on understanding and applying German grammar concepts and support sessions are available to students prior to the mock examinations.</p> <p>Students are entered for all 4 skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing at the same tier either Foundation (grades 1-5) or higher (grades 4-9). All skills are weighted equally (25% each).</p>
